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About Work Zone Safety Training

Intended For:

Road, street, traffic and utility workers - including supervisors, foreman and crew personnel whose routine duties include work within road and street right of ways; Individuals who are responsible for flagging assignments, as well as new employees. Emphasis on keeping workers and road users safe in the work zone, includes outdoor exercise for setup of a flagging operation (weather permitting)

Topics to be Covered:

Introduction, Goals of traffic control; Safety considerations; Traffic control devices and their maintenance; Setting up traffic control zones; Typical applications (class problems using Quick Reference Guide); Flagging procedures; Legal liability.

Course Request Requirements

If your agency is able to meet the following requirements, LTAP would love to schedule a date to hold this **free** class in your facility.

We require no less than 10 people in attendance and no more than 25 in order to travel to deliver this course. Another requirement for this course is to have a classroom or any space that may be used as a teaching space with tables and chairs for participants – we are able to bring a projector, laptop, screen, speakers, etc. for the training. We would also need an outdoor space that is close to the classroom in order to conduct the outdoor work zone setup exercise, such as a parking lot or field that we can block off from traffic to protect the safety of our participants.

This is a 3.5 hour course and typically we do a 7:30am set-up/registration with class lasting from 8:00am to 11:30am.
